



Sexual response cycle models can be helpful for providers when explaining the physical changes that occur in individuals' bodies during a sexual encounter to patients. While the original model proposed by Masters and Johnson in 1966 depicts a linear process that moves through four sequential phases, others have since proposed circular models of sexual response, such as the one developed by Rosemary Basson in the early 2000s.
